

## **UHF students excel in NET**

### **76 Postgraduate students from several disciplines qualify the National examination**

As many as 76 postgraduate students of the Dr YS Parmar University of Horticulture and Forestry have qualified the National Eligibility Test (NET) in 2018, thereby establishing the university's position among the top agricultural universities in the country.

Out of the total, 58 students are from the College of Horticulture while 19 students are from College of Forestry of the university. This number is a jump over the last year's number when 68 students had cleared the exams.

The students who have qualified the NET examination will be eligible for the selection to the post of Assistant Professors in the agricultural universities in the country.

The selected students belong to varied streams like Forest Products, Soil Science, Silviculture and Agroforestry, Basic Sciences, Environmental Science, Fruit Science, Floriculture and Landscape Architecture, Entomology, Vegetable Science, Biotechnology, Seed Science, Social Sciences, Plant Pathology and Management Sciences.

Over the years, the students of the university have performed well at the state and national level examinations with many going on to occupy top positions in national and international organizations.
